THE PETER JACYK COLLECTION OF UKRAINIAN SERIALS

The Chair of Ukrainian Studies and the Jacyk Microfilm Project

Since its inception in the fall of 1980, the Chair of Ukrainian Studies at the University of Toronto has made one of its primary goals the further strengthening of the Ukrainian research collection within the university library. One aspect of the Chair's work in this regard has been the creation of a comprehensive catalog of Ukrainian holdings throughout the University of Toronto library system. Another aspect has been to encourage the acquisition of new materials in all aspects of Ukrainian studies.

The first major addition brought to the University of Toronto through the auspices of the Chair is the Peter Jacyk Collection of Ukrainian Serials. This collection comprises over 400 reels of microfilm, containing complete or nearly complete runs of 175 newspapers and journals of western Ukrainian provenance published between the years 1848 and 1918. The vast majority of the material was microfilmed from the holdings at the Austrian National Library (Osterreichische Nationalbibliothek) in Vienna. As a result of acquiring the Jacyk microfilm collection, the University of Toronto now has the richest holdings of pre-1918 Ukrainian serials in North America, surpassing by far traditionally strong repositories such as the Library of Congress, the New York Public Library, and Harvard College Library.

The Background of the Collection

All the newspapers and journals in the Jacyk collection are of western Ukrainian origin that is they were published in the historic regions of Galicia, Bukovina, and Transcarpathia (Subcarpathian Rus'), which before 1918 had been part of the multinational Austro-Hungarian Empire. The largest and most important of these regions was the Austrian province of Galicia, where over 70 percent of the titles in this collection were published.

The chronological range of the titles in this collection coincides with the second half of the nineteenth century, a time when Ukrainians were experiencing a national revival. Although the vast majority of Ukrainians lived within the Russian Empire at that time, the tsarist government imposed heavy restrictions on the national movement, even forbidding after 1876 the appearance of all publications in the Ukrainian language. In stark contrast, Ukrainians in the Habsburg-

ruled Austro-Hungarian Empire, especially in the Austrian provinces of Galicia and Bukovina, were permitted relatively free development in cultural, educational, religious, and scholarly affairs.

To be sure, conditions in the Austro-Hungarian Empire were far from ideal. All the Habsburgruled Ukrainian lands were, for instance, so economically underdeveloped that unending poverty forced many families to seek a better life by emigrating abroad, especially to the United States and later Canada. Moreover, Transcarpathia suffered from Hungarian political discrimination as well as economic hardship, while Galicia became the scene for frequent conflict between Ukrainians and Poles, who dominated the political life of the province. Nonetheless, the rule of law and parliamentary government which characterized the Austro-Hungarian regime greatly stimulated the Ukrainian national revival, most especially in Galicia, at a time when it was denied any normal advancement within the Russian-controlled Dnieper, or eastern Ukraine. Not surprisingly, many national leaders from the Dnieper Ukraine helped to establish publications in Galicia where they were able to publish their works.

The collection of newspapers and journals listed in this catalog is concrete testimony to the vibrancy of Ukrainian life in late nineteenth century Austria-Hungary. The North American reader, at best acquainted with this material from bibliographical references, will surely be surprised by its wealth and breadth of subject matter, whether in publications devoted to literature, scholarship, politics, law, religion, education, economics, the cooperative movement, agriculture, hygiene, satire, or to popular education, and students and young people.

Here are to be found the oldest Ukrainian serials published anywhere (*Dnewnyk ruskij* and *Zoria halytska*, both beginning in 1848); the official organs of the oldest Galician cultural organizations (*Vremennyk* of the Stauropegial Institute, *Naukovyi sbornyk* of the Galician Rus' Matytsia, and *Vistnyk* of the National Home); the first periodicals to use western Ukrainian. Vernacular (*Vechernytsf, Meta, Rusalka*); the most important late nineteenth-century Ukrainian literary and public affairs journals (*Pravda, Zoria, Literaturno-naukovyi vistnyk, Zhytie* i *slovo*); the organs of varying national and political orientations (*Slovo,RusskaiaRada, Dilo, Bat'kovshchyna, Halychanyn, Ruslan, Narod, Russkoe slovo*); the authoritative scholarly journals of the Shevchenko Scientific Society (*Zapysky, Chasopys' pravnycha* i *ekonomichna*); and the publications of the national liberation movement during World War I (*Vistnyk Soiuza vyzvolennia Ukrai'ny, Ukrainisches Korrespondenzblatt*), including the only Hungarian journal devoted exclusively to Ukrainian affairs (*Ukninia*). These, of course, are, only a few of the titles which, taken in their entirety, are an incredibly rich source of data on all aspects of western Ukrainian society during its most vibrant period in modern history-the second half of the nineteenth century and first two decades of the twentieth century.

The Donor

Indeed, it would not have been possible for researchers in North America to have easy access to this unique collection were it not for Peter Jacyk, whose generous grant of \$47,000 provided the Chair of Ukrainian Studies with the means to undertake the microfilm project. Born in 1921 in the western Ukrainian (Galician) village of Synevids'ko Vyzhne that is located in the foothills of the Carpathian Mountains, Peter Jacyk belongs to that long line of Ukrainians who became successful in business and trade, and who then used their wealth to promote the needs of the national culture. In the sixteenth century, for instance, it was townsmen in the western Ukrainian lands who through their brotherhood organizations promoted the Orthodox revival and

thereby preserved Ukrainian-Rus' culture, while in the nineteenth century it was the landowner Vasyl' Karazyn, whose philanthropy made possible the establishment of the first modern university on Ukrainian territory at Kharkiv in 1805.

In the twentieth century, when Ukrainians have found themselves spread in a diaspora throughout several continents, it is to institutions in the emigration that wealthy Ukrainian patriots have turned their attention. As founding director of Prombank Investments and the Jacyk Group-corporations in Ontario, Canada concerned with land development, building, and investment - Peter Jacyk has in the past two decades contributed generously to Ukrainian higher education. He is the largest single donor to the Ukrainian program at Harvard University (which since 1968 has three endowed chairs and a research institute), and he is now one of the most outstanding contributors to the Chair of Ukrainian Studies at the University of Toronto. It is particularly fortunate that Ukrainian studies in North America have friends and supporters like Peter Jacyk.

Use of this Guide

The arrangement of this Guide to Newspapers and Periodicals in the Petro Jacyk Collection of Ukrainian Serials is alphabetical. Each entry includes the title, place of publication, years of appearance, frequency, microfilm holdings, hard copy holdings, and University of Toronto call number. The twelve titles preceded by an asterisk indicate that those items had in whole or in part already been in the University of Toronto Library before the acquisition of the present collection. Several of the entries are also accompanied by illustrations revealing some off the innovative graphics and exquisite designs used on the banners or title pages, which have artistic value in and of themselves.

All titles in the Cyrillic alphabet are transliterated according to the Library of Congress system, although diacritical marks and final hard signs have been omitted. Because western Ukrainian cultural life was marked before 1918 by a debate over national identity and the choice of an appropriate literary language, publications from that period may appear in several orthographies and in Ukrainian, Russian, or Old Ruthenian, a western Ukrainian recension of Church Slavonic (sometimes referred to by its critics with the derogatory term *iazychie* or macaronic jargon). Also, because the people and their leaders were still using at the time the traditional name Rusyn (rendered in the official German as *Ruthenen* or in English as Ruthenian), it is not surprising to find numerous titles which use various derivatives of the name Rus', such as *ruskyi, ruska, russkii, russkaia*.

Translations of all titles in this catalog reflect the original orthography and language of the first issue. Titles in Ukrainian or Russian will follow the Library of Congress transliteration system for those languages; titles in Old Ruthenian will follow the Library of Congress transliteration system for Ukrainian with the following additions: $\mathbf{b} = "; \mathbf{b} = \hat{\mathbf{y}}; \mathbf{y} = \hat{\mathbf{e}}; \hat{\mathbf{o}} = \hat{\mathbf{o}}; = \hat{\mathbf{i}}; \hat{\mathbf{u}} = \hat{\mathbf{i}}.$

Sources of Collection

The vast majority of the titles in this catalog are located in the Austrian National Library (Osterreichische Nationalbibliothek) in Vienna. Particular appreciation is extended to the directorate and staff of that institution, and especially to Maria Razumowsky (Head of Slavic Acquisitions) and Dr. Christl Pernold (Head of Photo reproduction). The actual microfilming was carried out by Mikrofilm Schmidl of St. Leonhard-am-Forst, Austria.

A few titles or parts of titles were obtained from other institutions. All Transcarpathian materials are located in and were microfilmed at the Szechenyi National Library (Orszagos Szechenyi Konyvtar) in Budapest, Hungary. Some other materials were obtained from the collections of the National Museum (Narodni Museum) in Prague, Czechoslovakia; Harvard College Library in Cambridge, Massachusetts; and the Episcopal and Heritage Institute Libraries of the Byzantine Catholic Diocese of Passaic, New Jersey. Appreciation is extended to all those institutions for allowing access to their collections.

Finally, the cataloging and prompt deposit of these materials in the John Robarts Library of the' University of Toronto is due to the concern and special efforts shown to this new collection by the staff of that institution, especially Marilyn L Sh_rrow, Chief Librarian; Dr. Iqbal Wagle, Head of the Microtext Division; Mary Stevens, Slavic Book Selector; and Wasyl Veryha and Luba Pendzey, Slavic Catalogers. Preparation of this catalog was made possible through the assistance of Nadia Odette Diakun, Research Assistant to the Chair of Ukrainian Studies.





The Peter Jacyk Collection of UKRAINIAN SERIALS

Presented to the LIBRARY UNIVERSITY OF TORONTO by the CHAIR OF UKRAINIAN STUDIES

Considering the importance of this microfilm project for Ukrainian studies in North America, a program and exhibit was held on February 19, 1983, on the occasion presenting the Peter Jacyk Collection of Ukrainian Serials to the University of Toronto Library. At the afternoon conference, opening remarks by Dr. Paul R. Magocsi, Chair of Ukrainian Studies at the University of Toronto were followed by Dr. Omeljan Pritsak, Mykhailo S. Hrushevskyi Professor of Ukrainian History, Harvard University, who spoke on the role of Galicia in Ukrainian and East European History. Most of the afternoon proceedings focussed on how the Jacyk Collection of Ukrainian Serials may be used for future research in Ukrainian studies. The value of the material for five subject areas was discussed: history by Professor Ivan L. Rudnytsky (University of Alberta); language by Professor Emeritus George Y. Shevelov (Columbia University); literature by Professor George G. Grabowicz (Harvard University); bibliography by Professor Bohdan Budurowycz (University of Toronto); and foreign relations by Professor John L. H. Keep (University of Toronto). The last paper was by Professor Myroslava Ciszkewycz (Ohio State University), who analyzed the artistic aspects of the serials collection, in particular the graphic design of the banners and title pages.

During the evening banquet, hosted by University of Toronto President James M. Ham, the microfilm collection was formally presented to the University of Toronto Library. Greetings were delivered by Dr. George Ignatieff, Chancellor, University of Toronto, and brief remarks during the presentation were given by Peter Jacyk, donor; Frederick Istl, Consul-General of Austria; and Marilyn L. Sharrow, Chief Librarian.

To complement the program, a month-long exhibit during February was held in the John Robarts Library. The display cases adjacent to the main entrance contained photographic reproductions of banners from all 175 titles in the Jacyk microfilm collection as well as rare nineteenth century publications from western Ukrainian lands held in the University of Toronto Library. The exhibit was put together by a committee including Bohdan Budurowycz, Paul R. Magocsi, and Luba Pendzey.
