COVERAGE The collection includes 115,000 biographical entries taken from lexica, handbooks, yearbooks, almanacs and biographical reference works. It contains articles on some 90,000 people (often more than one article about one person) from Hungarian history beginning in the 9th century through the founding of the Habsburg Empire, its division following the Austro-Prussian War (1866), the Austro-Hungarian Dual Monarchy (the so-called Austro-Hungarian settlement), up to the present.

People who exerted influence on the politics, economy, religion, art and culture of Hungary throughout its history are represented in this Archive. Hungary also exerted its own influence on the development of the peoples of surrounding territories, e.g. in the crown lands of Sibenburgen, Upper Hungary, parts of Slovenia, Croatia, and the Kraina. Therefore, the collection includes biographies of people of non-Hungarian origin.

Biographies from sources which have documented Hungarian emigration throughout the world are also included. Due to the diverse nature of Hungary's political, economic and cultural development, the select source works published between 1559 and 1990 are in Hungarian, Latin, German, English, etc.
